Sercial	Verdelho	Bual	Malmsey
Sercial is the driest varietal, with a late ripening and quite low in alcohol before fortification. Pale, light-bodied and dry, this is a fresh invigorating wine with some oxidative notes. About 48 g/l residual.	Verdelho is grown on the north of the island at an altitude up to 1300 ft. Golden in color, this has marginally more body than the Sercial, and is a tangy fine textured wine. About 75 g/l residual.	Bual, (or Boal) is a vigorous varietal that does best on the south coast. Picking is early and produces a medium rich wine with good acidity and balancing sweetness. Copper-colored, full-bodied and fruity with an attractive smoky complexity. About 100 g/l residual	Malmsey/Malvasia, possibly the best-known Madeira, has high levels of both sugar and acidity. Malmsey is found predominately on the northern side of the island. Medium dark to dark, a luscious rich soft-textured wine, distinctly full, honeyed and mellow. About 123 g/l residual
